Sr. Warden's Report

The Vestry retreat was as uplifting and powerfully motivating as we all hoped it would be. Saturday morning, Vestry and staff met with the Building and Grounds, Long Range Planning and Capital Campaign Committees to hear and discuss their reports. The reports and discussion demonstrated that St. Luke's is a community with unity that is forward-looking and faithful.

The Building and Grounds Committee introduced the general concept of how the North Entrance can be improved to make it more welcoming to those who first enter on that side of the building. Soon they will have renderings for the whole parish to be able to see what is being planned. Paul Rash showed us his beautiful design for a bell tower to house the new bell donated by Carey and Ruth Walton.

The Long Range Planning Committee presented their recommendations for a multi-use meeting space to complement our beautiful sanctuary and for refurbishing the sanctuary to repair the wear and tear of 50 years. Other needs were discussed (the education building, healing center, youth center, etc.), which are part of the master plan, but are not as pressing a priority as is a gathering space that can hold our growing congregation. The consensus is that Harman Hall has served the church well, but has outlived its productive years.

On the Capital Campaign Committee's recommendation the Vestry authorized the engagement of Generis to begin an assessment of St. Luke's ability to proceed with the first phase (the multi-purpose meeting space and sanctuary refurbishment). Subsequently, the Executive Committee met with Gary Ealy, the Generis consultant, who worked with the parish three years ago in a stewardship campaign. He is helping us to develop a survey and to conduct focus meetings and personal interviews so that we will be able to evaluate the parish's commitment to provide for the church's facility needs for the coming years.

The following table presents a summary of the 2005 operating fund revenues and expenses through the end of **February, 2006**, as compared to the new 2006 budget on a year-to-date basis ("YTD").

Notes: The Diocesan assessment was kindly reduced to \$100,000 as requested, with a request that if St. Luke's is able to pay the full \$114,000, as assessed, that it do so. Here, the budgeted figure is based upon a \$100,000 assessment.

Facilities expense is projected at \$200k per year which was the actual 2005 figure.

Extra Income received to date is due in part to 2006 prepaid pledges. Please keep pledges current, with thanks.
