Enlarging The Entrance To God's Church

For many years more and more parishioners have used the north entrance to our church. As many of you know, the church was not designed that way. The main entrance was at Royal Lane with a side entrance from Jamestown Street. That design was done when Royal Lane was a two lane street and it carried about one-fourth of the traffic that it carries now.

As Dallas has grown, so has the area around our church. Now Royal Lane is a major arterial. Parishioners attending St. Luke's have been turning right at Jamestown and parking along Jamestown or in the area in back of the church. That is why the north entrance has become so popular.

There is relief on the way! Very soon the north entrance will be expanded to accommodate more people and will have the appearance of an entrance more than a backdoor. There will be a lot more room to accommodate those who are entering the church as well as the gathering of the choir, priests and other members of the altar party as they prepare to process. The Greeters will actually have room to greet and talk to newcomers when they enter the church. God is good!!!!



This does not mean that we will not be using the original entrance. It will be used as it always has been as an entrance and as a gathering place for wedding parties and families attending a funeral. We plan to eventually furnish this entrance with furniture and rugs, giving it a parlor appearance for small receptions, meetings and bible studies.

The Building and Grounds Committee studied this area for months and finally, after much deliberation, came up with a very workable solution. The idea was presented to the Vestry and they have approved the plan. The cost of this expansion will be covered by a very generous memorial contribution to the church from Nancy Love's family in her memory.

The plans for this expanded entrance will be posted in a convenient area for everyone to see in the next few weeks. The construction will be done during the month of August so it can be completed by the time we have the Ministry Fair in the fall.

Fr. Magoola Called as Priest Assistant

The Vestry has voted unanimously to have Fr. Robert Magoola transition from part-time supply clergy at St. Luke's to full-time Priest Assistant. He has been widely embraced by our Parish and it has become very evident that this is a very gifted, loving and holy man.

He was ordained as an Anglican Priest in 1994. After serving as curate in several

parishes, he became priest-in-charge of a congregation in Uganda which has 1000 in regular Sunday attendance. He is most recently a graduate student at Dallas Theological Seminary.

One of his primary ministry areas will be communications. He will regularly be involved in the preparation of bulletins and other printed materials. This will

provide much relief for our hard working director of communications, John Moore, and enable him to focus more time as the editor of the Evangeline.

Fr. Robert will also teach in the Children's Sunday school, assisting with the spiritual formation of our middle school age children. He will serve as the Chaplain to the Sunday School and our children and teachers will benefit greatly from his spiritual and educational leadership.

Fr. Robert holds a Masters in Pastoral Care from DTS, which will serve us well as he assists Fr. Spafford and the other clergy with pastoral counsel and care for members who are hospitalized or home bound.

Surveys Collected and Forwarded to Generis Partners

Our thanks to everyone who has taken the opportunity to complete the survey regarding your views on St. Luke's and the future of our parish. The number of surveys that have been submitted thus far indicates that there is a very high level of interest and support for the future of our church.

As a continuation of our assessment process, our consulting firm, Generis Partners will begin to analyze the surveys over the next 30-45 days. After their analysis is completed, preliminary feedback will be reported back to our Vestry, Clergy and Capital Campaign Committee. The next phase of our discernment process will include "listening sessions" or Town Hall Meetings which will enable St. Luke's to gather even more feedback from a broad cross section of our members. These group discussions will be conducted by Generis and at the present time, we expect to schedule these important sessions sometime in the early Fall. Additional information regarding the details of these meetings will be announced later this summer.

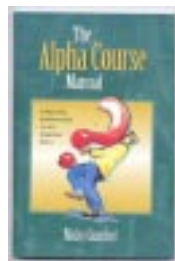
