PARISH-WIDE SURVEY KICK OFF

Our Parish wide meeting held after the 10:00 AM and River services on Sunday, May 21st experienced a wonderful turnout. My thanks to every one of you who attended and spent the time completing the survey. Our spirit-filled discussion concerning the future of St. Luke's, particularly as it related to the prospect of embarking on a capital campaign, indicated to me that a significant number of people in our parish family (both old and new members) truly care about the future of our church. In my opinion, and I believe that this opinion is shared by a notable number of other parishioners, St. Luke's is in a wonderful place as we continue to grow both spiritually and in the number of people who are now making St. Luke's their church home. We quite possibly could be in the best position we have been in a very long time to embark on a campaign that will enable us to not only renovate our sanctuary but also build new and improved space to serve our parish in a variety of ways.

It is vitally important that everyone has the opportunity to offer their feedback concerning your feelings about the future of St. Luke's. In addition to the written survey, we will be scheduling both "listening sessions" as well as one-on-one interviews in late June or early July (exact dates for these sessions along with additional information to follow shortly). All of your feedback will directly impact future decisions made by the Vestry and our Clergy as it pertains to the feasibility of successfully embarking on a capital campaign in the future.

OUR DEADLINE FOR COMPLETING SURVEYS HAS BEEN EXTENDED TO JUNE 15th.

If it is God's will for St. Luke's to move ahead with plans to create an even more inviting worship space and campus, then let his will be known through our feelings and vision for the future of his/our church.

A Letter from Bishop Stanton

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The General Convention of the Episcopal Church begins at Columbus, Ohio on June 13, 2006. Those of you who have access to the internet, or access to friends or family who do, undoubtedly know that the air is thick with prognostications, predictions, warnings, forebodings, and the pushing of various points. This is, I am persuaded, neither the time nor the place to contribute further to this anxious moment in the life of the Church to which we belong and which we love.

Instead, I am issuing a call to all the congregations of this Diocese, to all the Clergy and all the members of the Lay Order: I call upon all of us to set apart Monday, June 12th, as a day of prayer and fasting for the General Convention of the Episcopal Church. I call upon the Clergy to offer the Holy Eucharist on that day with special intention for the Convention, and to set apart additional times of vigil for the people to offer their prayers and intercessions for the bishops and deputies who will go the Convention.

The fast will be offered throughout the day from sunrise to sunset. Traditionally a fast includes abstinence from food, but may also involve abstaining from other customary comforts. The point of the fast is to concentrate our attention on God and His will for us and to be sustained by both praying and reading God's Word.

June 12th is additionally the day for the transferred observance of St. Barnabas the Apostle. This, I think, is most appropriate. For it is the apostolic ministry of the bishops and the whole Church which should concern us as members of the Body of Christ, and which we pray will inspire and infuse the members of the General Convention. St. Barnabas was known by the nickname, "Son of Comfort," because he gave of himself to support the earliest Christian community at Jerusalem. Let us give of ourselves to support the work of the Church around the world. Since the observance of St. Barnabas is called a feast, I suggest that at the conclusion of the fast during the day some means of honoring the Apostle mark the conclusion of the day.

Family Ministry Summer Activities

It's remarkable, really. Literally hundreds of references present themselves if you search for Bible phrases involving "children." There are certainly more than I have time to investigate! Therefore, I recall a verse which I believe to be more inspiring than any other; that found in the 18th chapter of Luke:

"But Jesus called the children to him and said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these."

Jesus does not call to other people. Jesus does not call to nearby parents. He doesn't call to babysitters or caregivers or nannies. He calls the children to him. It is in faith that those around him bring their children to Jesus to be healed. They want their children to be, and I quote, "touched." In their efforts to shield and buffer Jesus from the masses, his disciples unknowingly try to sever the most important relationship that can be created: that between Jesus and children. What does Jesus say? Receive the kingdom of God like a child. Unconditionally. Whole heartedly. With colossal anticipation. How great is that!

Youth have always been a primary focus at St. Luke's. Our church does all it can to ensure our children will be "touched" by Jesus so that they know He is alive and with them! Summer time is no exception. If you think youth activities slow down during the summer months at St. Luke's, think again!! We have lots of exciting activities and events planned this summer. Here are some dates that you may want to put on your calendar and events in which you may want to consider participating.

Vacation Bible School. If it's one thing that St. Luke's does really well, it's Vacation Bible School!! When Josh and Janine came to St. Luke's, they brought their love for and devotion to this impoverished community. From July 22 – 29, a youth group will accompany them to Belize to conduct a Vacation Bible school for the children of San Ignacio. The older youth will also participate in construction projects to help build up the area. The trip builds the faith of children, it builds the resources for the residents.

So now you know about some of the major events happening at St. Luke's this summer. The youth will also have the opportunity to participate in other fun events locally that Scott will put together. So even though we are entering the lazy, hazy days of summer, there is lots going on and lots to get excited about at St. Luke's. Make sure you are part of the adventure!

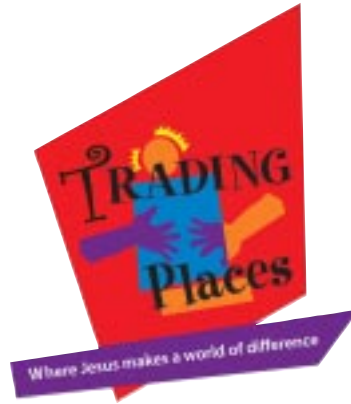
